


Art Exhibition: "Art is not a thing; it is a way"

When I went home I looked at all the stuff I had laying around and thought that if I did show all them together it would look like either I had multiple personalities or




As my teacher said...

Sometimes to influence people as well


This was part of a series about steeplechasing...I used the metaphor of carousel horses...

They are thrown away when they are broken




Sometimes about particular people or situationS

I wanted to capture this kind, generous, intelligent, thoughtful and express my feelings for him


He was actually killing aliens or something on the x box




Another view of Ben



Sometimes it observations about human behaviour









Sometimes it is the form of a funny drawing to perhaps give a message I wouldn't say

Like "no I'm too busy to make a drawing for you"




Investigating meaning..

Made several images of scrub that I saw on Kangaroo island
Trying to understand why I found it interesting, appealing
Realised it was the mysterious feel...the depth, the lovely lines of the trees and
branches and the contrast...all those things are formal elements that some theorists
would argue have no place in art education now...




Started painting it with broad brushstrokes..but realised that it didn't work like that...had more interest as a drawing....so reverted to oil paints and laid layers and layers of drawn marks so it is a painted drawing then used glazes to add colour, depth etc



Just as a pianist has to practice so do I
The challenge is to take your easel etc and make an image in a short time..especially difficult when its water ...the light and colour keeps changing




Sometimes it is because I want to teach a particular technique or method and so have to have a go myself to remind me of the issues involved in that technique.... Silkscreen printmaking






Using methods of the old masters Titian

Sometimes not for public display..purely personal


This is $\mbox{my sister's funeral}$..with her little kids playing in the red dirt at Aldgate cemetery

I wrote this bit because I still have trouble saying the words


when my sister died I didn't want to leave her alone I found a notebook in my bag and drew her




Like a postcard a record of travels China




